We've worked hard to make improvements to our annual meeting with the implementation of SurveyMonkey for our annual meeting evaluations and implementation of an audience response system that we hope will be used more widely in the coming years. The ANA workshop that was held this year included data and feedback from many of our members who took the survey on ANA practices well ahead of the meeting, enabling a robust and meaningful discussion at the annual meeting. - Our members continue to work with the ABB (American Board of Bioanalysis) and contribute towards the immunology section of the board certification exam for High-complexity Clinical Laboratory Directors.
- Encouraging discussions have been ongoing with ASCP regarding a certification exam for individuals wishing to pursue a laboratory director career in medical laboratory immunology.

I would like to thank all of the individuals who have put a great deal of time into these efforts.

The education committee has an exciting agenda that we will hear more about in the coming year. We would like our members to engage actively with this committee and contribute to their efforts to share and expand our knowledge within our areas of expertise.

Mentorship and the development of mentee-mentor relationships is a new initiative for AMLI, proposed by Dr. Barbara Detrick. We look forward to the development of this initiative and hope to engage many of you as this program develops.

The 2020 annual meeting will be here before we know it! Based on the results of the survey that was sent out to all of you last week, we will be trying out a 3-day meeting format in 2020.
